Designed to meet the needs and desires of children today, our friendly, interactive and entertaining approach provides them with the social and communication skills necessary to present themselves confidently in today’s increasingly competitive society.

Etiquette Curriculum: Each of the 5 sessions includes 45 minutes of dance instruction and a 45 minute etiquette lesson. Topics include: Positive First Impressions and Fluid Introductions, Social Grace and Civil Behavior, Table Tools and Dining Decorum, and The Art of Communication: Online vs. Offline Behavior. Integral to the program is the formal multi-course dining tutorial which takes place in March prior to the Passover and Easter holidays. A final presentation and party in May provides the children with an opportunity to demonstrate what they have learned.

Ballroom Dance Instruction: Sessions begin with a short demonstration followed by a breakdown of a variety of ballroom dances ranging from the Merengue to the Fox Trot, Rumba, Tango and Swing.

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"LET'S DANCE!" ETIQUETTE CURRICULUM—SEASON #11

Session 1: Positive First Impressions & Fluid Introductions

We begin the program by introducing the children to the world of etiquette and manners. In this session, they learn the importance of poise and posture in making a positive first impression. Appropriate attire, hygiene and grooming is addressed as well as a quick analysis of proper speech and diction. Once the children have discovered how to make a good first impression, they are ready to master the skill of introducing themselves as well as others using both the formal and informal forms. The three basic rules of introduction will be practiced along with learning how to properly shake hands, make good eye contact and smile when meeting and greeting people.

Session 2: Social Grace & Civil Behavior

Kindness and consideration for one's fellow human being is at the basis of good character. In this session, the "Golden Rule" will be discussed along with elements that comprise a person of good character such as courtesy, thoughtfulness and cooperation. Good character goes hand in hand with ethical behavior. Children will learn the importance of living a life that is honest, finding the power within to do the right thing and how to handle situations with tact and diplomacy. An in-depth discussion on how their choices define who they are and have a direct affect on others will also be addressed.

Session 3: Table Tools & Dining Decorum

This special multi-course dining tutorial session takes place right before the Passover and Easter holidays and provides children with the tools they will need to enjoy the fine dining and entertaining experience. They will be educated on all of the elements of the table including formal and informal place settings, styles of eating, finished and resting positions, napkin placement and usage and the role of toasting. Additionally, children will understand the role of the gracious host and respectful guest, gift giving protocols and showing appreciation and thanks.

Session 4: The Art of Communication: Online vs. Offline Behavior

Next we focus on communication skills and the power of our words whether written, spoken or electronically transmitted. We start with the art of conversation including basic speaking and listening skills and verbal vs. non verbal language and then move into more traditional topics such as telephone etiquette and stationery correspondence. We complete the cycle by dissecting our more modern forms of communicating including cell phone etiquette, email etiquette, texting, Skyping and Facetime and the use (and abuse) of social media including Instagram, Twitter, FB, YouTube and more.

Session 5: Dance Demonstration, Awarding of Certificates & Final Party

By the time the children reach the final session in May they are ready to flaunt their good manners and put them to use. The evening begins with a formal dance demonstration by all of the students followed by the awarding of the Certificates of Completion, and concludes with a celebratory treat for both the children and their families.

Dress Code:

Gentleman are required to wear: slacks and button down shirts and dress shoes. No athletic socks or tennis shoes please. A suit, jacket and tie are optional, with the exception of the dining session and the final party. All attire should be clean, presentable and age appropriate. A dressing room is available on the premises if necessary.

Rules of Conduct:

Proper attire and behavior are expected at "Let's Dance!" Cotillion. All students should behave respectfully and graciously towards their instructors, as well as their peers. The program is conducted at the famed Beverly Wilshire (A Four Seasons Hotel) and a code of conduct is expected upon entering, and departing the premises. Disruptive students may be asked not to return.

Arrival and Attendance:

Students should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the start time of the class to allow for sign in and name tags. It is expected that students will attend all classes, except in the case of illness.
